

Romy Pfeifer's photographs unfold as a silent and profound hymn to nature—an act of listening rather than representation. Her images evoke the landscape, transforming it into a mental and sensorial space where memory, perception, and emotion intertwine. Each photograph appears as a page from a visual diary, in which the artist's intimate experience takes shape through light, movement, and layering.
